Travelling to College

Though many of our students live in the Scarborough area, many also travel from the surrounding areas. We do not want travel to be a barrier to you taking advantage of the many opportunities the College has to offer. The sections below explain how we can help you with the financial costs of travelling to College. The subsequent pages provide details of the bus services available to you.

Free transport

If you live 2.5 miles or more from College and are from a household where the income is less than £25,000 per annum, you may be entitled to financial support towards the cost of travel to College. Please complete and return to College a Student Financial Support form, along with your Travel to College application form. Both of these forms are available to download from our website or can be collected from the Student Services helpdesk at the College

Subsidised transport: “Pay no more than £12 a week”

Irrespective of household income, the College will subsidise bus transport costs, so that no student who lives more than 3 miles from College has to pay more than £12 per week. *[Based on lowest cost transport arrangements and subject to a maximum subsidy of £600 per year.]*

Arrangements may vary dependent on your circumstances, but normally you will need to provide receipts for reimbursement on a monthly basis. To apply for the travel subsidy, you must complete a Student Support Fund application form available from our website or from Student Services.

Even if you are awarded free or subsidised transport you must still make a separate application for your bus pass.

Travel to Learn Scholarship

Students who live more than 15 miles from the College and are expecting to achieve a 7, 8 or 9 in both English Language and Maths at GCSE are eligible to apply for our £440 a year Travel to Learn Scholarship. Further details are available on our website.

North Yorkshire County Council (NYCC) Bus Services

If you are 16-18 years old and the College is the nearest establishment to where you live offering a course suitable to your career choice or a pre-requisite for entry into higher education, then you can apply for an annual bus pass from NYCC (subject to approval). NYCC charge £490 for their annual bus passes (£245 if on low income) (**NYCC price may change for 2020/2021**); payment can be made in 9 monthly instalments by direct debit. There are exemptions from paying e.g. students with an educational health care plan.

Please note, the NYCC annual bus pass may not be your cheapest option, so investigate all your options.

- Students travelling from the **Whitby, Bridlington, and Helmsley/Pickering** areas can purchase an annual pass directly from the College at a cost of £440. The application forms for these services are available to download from the College's website.
- Please note that although the College provides the passes for the Whitby & Helmsley/Pickering services; the transport is organised by NYCC and Arriva for Whitby and NYCC for Helmsley/Pickering
- Financial assistance for households with an annual income of under £25,000 may be available through the College's Student Support Fund.
- Local public transport services with weekly savers or other discounts – check your local bus company's website (for those living in the Scarborough area, see below).

Low cost travel for students living in Scarborough area

If you live within the Scarborough area (up to West Ayton, Cloughton, Cayton & Seamer) then the local bus company, East Yorkshire Motor Services (EYMS) provides a range of tickets and discounts on their public bus service:

- Weekly tickets are available at a cost of £11.50 per week.

The weekly ticket or the discount cards have the advantage that they can be used to travel to College at any time of day and for travel at weekends and evenings.

Student Financial Support

(16 – 18 year olds – 2020/21)

Please note that the information in this leaflet is provisional and may be subject to change dependent on the level and conditions of government funding for the 2019/20 academic year.

The following support is provided by the College to help you overcome any financial barriers to successful completion of your studies at S6F.

Entitlement for all students

- ☺ Subsidised bus transport costs, so that you do not have to pay more than £12 per week*
- ☺ Free textbooks and materials essential to your courses and a printing allowance
- ☺ Free examination entries (excluding re-sits)
- ☺ Access to free or low-cost extra-curricular activities (e.g. sport, music)
- ☺ Eligibility for NUS card, which gives access to various on-line and in-store discounts
- ☺ Parents eligible to claim Child Benefit, if you are on a full-time course.

**Subject to a maximum subsidy from the College of £600 p.a.*

Guaranteed Bursary

You as a student are eligible to apply for a bursary of £1,200 a year if:

- you are in care or leaving care; OR
- you personally are in receipt of Income Support or Universal Credit; OR
- you receive both Employment Support Allowance and Disability Living Allowance (or Universal Credit as a replacement for ESA and Personal Independence Payments) in your own right.

Free Meals Entitlement & Discretionary Funds

If you are from a low-income household (**below £25,000 p.a.**), then you are eligible to apply for contributions towards:

- ☺ Transport to College
- ☺ Lunches
- ☺ College-related costs, such as trips, exam re-sits, university visits and UCAS fees.

If you or your parents meet the government's eligibility criteria for free meals (e.g. in receipt of certain benefits, such as Income Support, Universal Credit) then you are entitled to **£2.50** per day for a meal at College. This allocation is topped up monthly onto a cashless payment card for use in Café 6.

Additional support may be available if there are exceptional circumstances – e.g. if you are living independently but not entitled to benefits, or if you care for a disabled parent or sibling.

Other Funds and Support

You may also be eligible for grants or benefits from external agencies. For example, two local charities provide grants for students in need. The government's **Care to Learn** grant is available to help with childcare costs and the Ministry of Defence has a separate scheme to support the children of servicemen and women killed on active service.

Students within the College catchment area, but not living within walking distance of an NYCC bus service

If the College is the nearest provider for you and if you live over one mile from the nearest pick-up point for an NYCC bus service; then NYCC normally offer either a mileage allowance to the pick-up point or provide alternative arrangements.

For example:

- *If you live in Sherburn, NYCC may provide you with a bus pass at £490 p.a. for the 843 Coastliner. (Price subject to change for 2020/21)*
- *If you live in Hackness, NYCC may provide you either with a minibus service or with a mileage allowance to the nearest NYCC service pick-up point.*
